Boise State University responds to the needs of students in the Canyon County area with undergraduate and graduate class offerings at two convenient locations – Columbia High School and College of Western Idaho.

CLASSES HELD AUGUST 24 - DECEMBER 17

For the convenience of our students who live or work outside Boise, our regional sites offer many courses at a location near you. Offerings include core classes, general undergraduate and graduate classes, and degree programs. Classes are scheduled during the day, in the evening and on the weekend.

IMPORTANT CHANGE TO FULL-TIME STUDENT STATUS: Beginning Fall 2009, a full-time undergraduate student at Boise State University will be defined, for fee paying purposes, as a student enrolled in 12 or more credits and 9 or more credits for graduate students. Currently, students taking 8 or more credits are defined as full-time for tuition and fee paying purposes.

NON-DEGREE SEEKING STUDENTS: Please note that non-degree seeking students will still be limited to any combination of courses totaling seven or fewer credits; or a maximum of two courses, even if these courses total more than seven credits.

IMPORTANT FEE POLICY

Once you register for classes/workshops, you remain registered and are held responsible for the fees and grades assessed for these classes unless you cancel your registration. *If you do not pay for or do not attend these classes, you are still held responsible for the fees and grades assessed.* If you decide not to attend any classes, you must drop all of them (including classes and workshops that begin later in the semester) by going to brconcweb.boisestate.edu no later than Thursday,

August 20. If you do not cancel your registration or pay your fees by the fee payment deadline, you will remain registered, you will be charged course fees, and you will be assessed a \$50 late penalty.

NOTE: Students in the Masters classes can add/drop without a W, and receive a refund through the first scheduled day of class.

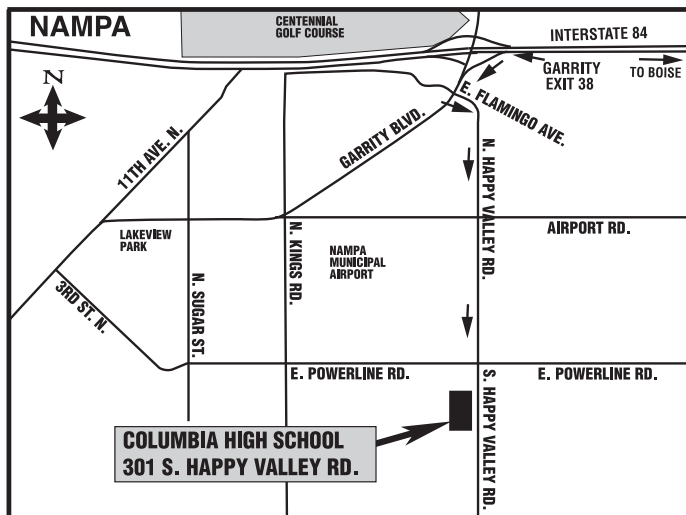

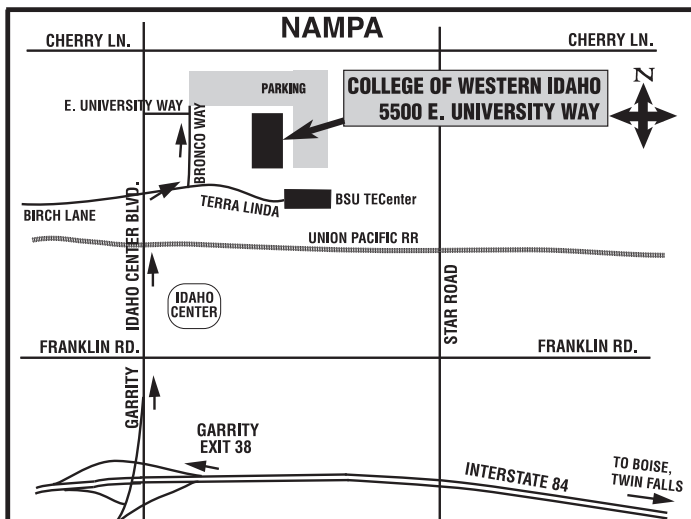
