If our office comes to the determination your parent filed incorrectly, you will be asked to provide a signed copy of an amended 2023 tax return 1040-X showing their corrected tax filing status.

For further guidance and explanations regarding the IRS criteria, please refer to [IRS Publication 17, Part One, Chapter 2, under the Head of Household filing status heading](#). You may be able to file as head of household if you meet all of the following requirements.

1. You are unmarried or considered unmarried on the last day of the year.
2. You paid more than half of the cost of keeping up a home for the year.
3. A qualifying person lived with you in the home for more than half the year (except for temporary absences, such as school). However, if the qualifying person is your dependent parent, your dependent parent doesn't have to live with you.

To be filled out by your Parent:

Requirement 1 – Were you unmarried or “considered unmarried” on the last day of 2023?

Considered Unmarried: To qualify for head of household status, you must be either unmarried or considered unmarried on the last day of the year. You are considered unmarried on the last day of the tax year if you meet **all** of the following criteria. For more information, please refer to the [IRS Publication 17, Part One, Chapter 2, Head of Household](#) section, under the Considered Unmarried heading.

1. You file a separate return. A separate return includes a return claiming married filing separately, single, or head of household filing status.
2. You paid more than half of the cost of keeping up your home for the tax year.
3. Your spouse did not live in your home during the last 6 months of the tax year. Your spouse is considered to live in your home even if your spouse is temporarily absent due to special circumstances.
4. Your home was the main home of your child, stepchild, or foster child for more than half the year.
5. You must be able to claim the child as a dependent.

Requirement 2 – Did you pay more than half of the cost of keeping up a home for 2023?

Keeping Up a Home: To qualify for head of household status, you must pay more than half of the cost of keeping up a home for the year. You can determine whether you paid more than half of the cost of keeping up a home by using [Worksheet 2-1](#) in IRS Publication 17. The costs you include are expenses such as rent, mortgage interest, real estate taxes, insurance on the home, repairs, utilities, and food eaten in the home. Do not include the costs of clothing, education, medical treatment, vacations, life insurance, or transportation. Also, do not include the value of your services or those of a member of your household.

Requirement 3 – Did a “qualifying person” live with you in your home for more than half of 2023?

Qualifying Person: A qualifying person includes a qualifying child (such as your son, daughter, or grandchild), who you also claim as a dependent, a qualifying relative who is your father or mother, who you can also claim as a dependent, or a qualifying relative (such as a grandparent, brother, or sister), who you can also claim as a dependent. For more information on who is a qualifying person, [see Table 2-1](#) in IRS Publication 17. Any person not described in Table 2-1 is not a qualifying person.
