- If you currently have on-campus work and scholarships, explain why those are not sufficient
- Guarantee that employment will not interfere with your studies

Create and attach a budget of current school/living expenses and current income, to show how much is still needed. Provide documentation of current financial availability (3 most recent pay slips if you have on-campus or other employment, copy of scholarship letters, bank statements etc.).

Attach a copy of your current I-20 and I-94 form.
