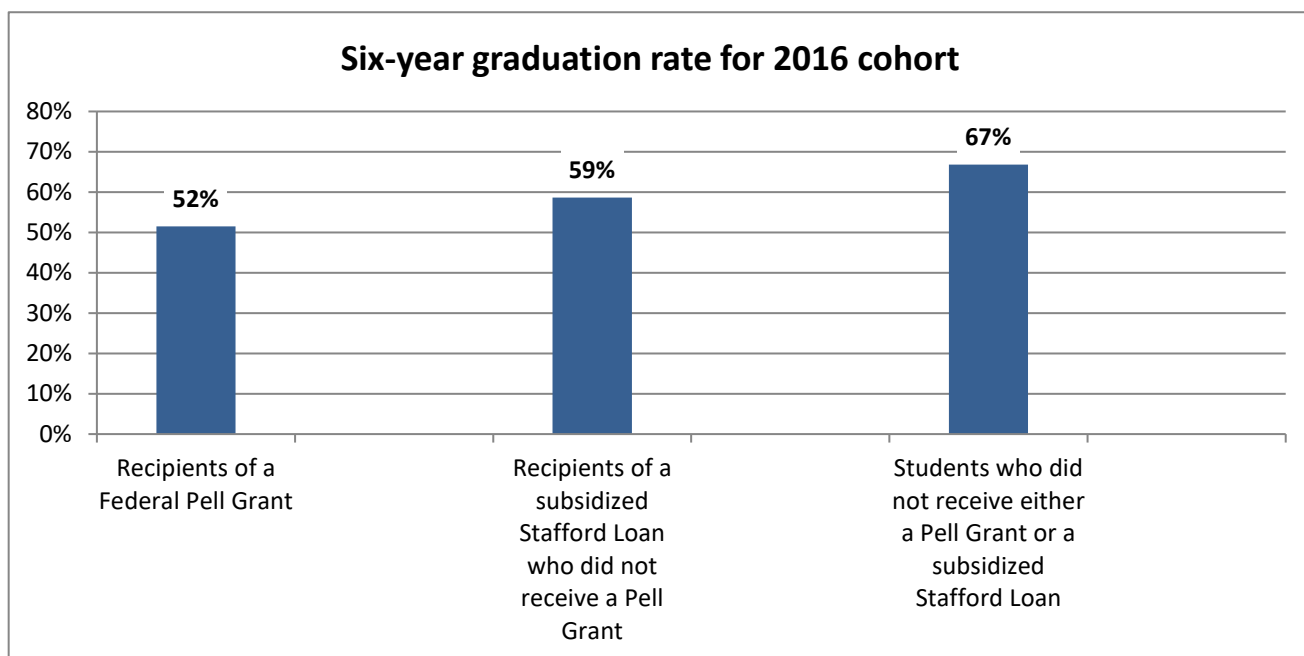

Four-year graduates - Of the initial 2016 cohort, how many completed the program in four years or less (by Aug. 31, 2020)	205	195	656
Five-year graduates - Of the initial 2016 cohort, how many completed the program in more than four years but in five years or less (after Aug. 31, 2020 and by Aug. 31, 2021)	124	76	254
Six-year graduates - Of the initial 2016 cohort, how many completed the program in more than five years but in six years or less (after Aug. 31, 2021 and by Aug. 31, 2022)	41	20	58
